STIPULATION AND [PROPOSED]
ORDER TO CONTINUE INITIAL
HEARING REGARDING
MODIFICATION OF

18 IT IS HEREBY STIPULATED AND AGREED by and between Plaintiff,
19 United States of America, by and through its attorney of record, Assistant United
20 States Attorney, Angela Davis, and defendant Gregory Evans, by and through his
21 attorney of record, Deputy Federal Public Defender, Jesus G. Bernal, that:

22 1. By letter dated January 6, 2004, the U.S. Probation Office has requested
23 that the Court modify Mr. Evans' conditions of supervised release.

24 2. The Court initially set February 9, 2004 at 1:30 p.m. as the date and time
25 for the initial hearing to address the U.S. Probation Office's request. By stipulation,
26 the initial hearing was continued to February 23, 2004 at 1:30 p.m.

27 3. U.S. Probation Officer William R. Crovella has submitted confidential
28 recommendations to the Court regarding possible modification to the terms of Ms.

1 Evans' supervised release. Because the recommendations are confidential, neither
2 party has knowledge of what modifications are being proposed.

3 4. On February 18, 2004, Defense counsel spoke with Assistant United
4 States Attorney Angela Davis. Ms. Davis indicated that the government has no
5 opposition to continuing the hearing for one week, so long as the probation office did
6 not object.


7 5. Defense counsel spoke with Mr. Crovella on February 19, 2004. At that
8 time, Mr. Crovella indicated that he agrees that the confidential recommendations
9 submitted to the Court be revealed to the parties. Mr. Crovella also stated that he has
10 no opposition to continuing the initial hearing for one week in order for the parties to
11 receive the confidential recommendations and, if necessary, to respond to them before
12 the initial hearing.

13 6. The parties thus agree that the hearing in this matter be continued from
14 February 23, 2004 at 1:30 p.m. to March 1, 2004 at 1:30 p.m. The parties further
15 agree that the Court direct the U.S. Probation Office to provide to the parties copies of
16 the confidential recommendations submitted to the Court.
