Articles of Incorporation of

Security B-Sides A California Public Benefit Corporation

ONE: The name of this corporation is Security B-Sides.

TWO: This corporation is a nonprofit public benefit corporation and is not organized for the private gain of any person. It is organized under the Nonprofit Public Benefit Corporation Law for charitable purposes. This corporation is organized exclusively for charitable, educational, and scientific purposes, including for such purposes, the making of distributions to organizations that qualify as exempt organizations under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or corresponding section of any future federal (ax code).

The specific purpose for which this corporation is organized is to educate, stimulate and develop the public, including but not limited to, material related to technology, mathematics and engineering education.

THREE: No agents, member, officer, or director of this corporation shall be personally liable for the debts or obligations of this corporation to the fullest extent permitted under California law, nor shall any of the property of the agents, members, officer, or directors be subject to the payment of the debts or obligations of this corporation.

FOUR: The name and address in the State of California of this corporation's initial agent for service of process is Michael Dahn, 3258 Market St #4. San Francisco, CA 94114.

- **FIVE:** (a) This corporation is organized and operated exclusively for charitable, educational, and scientific purposes meeting the requirements of Section 214 of the California Revenue and Taxation Code, within the meaning of Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code.
 - (b) Notwithstanding any other provision of these articles, the corporation shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on (1) by a corporation exempt from federal income tax under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code or (2) by a corporation contributions to which are deductible under Section 170(c)(2) of the Internal Revenue Code.
 - (c) No substantial part of the activities of this corporation shall consist of carrying on propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the corporation shall not participate or intervene in any political campaign (including the publishing or distribution of statements) on behalf of, or in opposition to, any candidate for public office.

SIX: The property of this corporation is irrevocably dedicated to charitable, educational, and scientific purposes meeting the requirements of Section 214 oft he California Revenue and Taxation Code, and no part of the net income or assets of the organization shall ever inure to the benefit of any director, officer, or member thereof or to the benefit of any private person.

On the dissolution or winding up of the corporation, its assets remaining after payment of, or provision for payment of, all debts and liabilities of this corporation, shall be distributed to a nonprofit fund, foundation, or corporation which is organized and operated exclusively for charitable, educational, and scientific purposes and which has established its tax-exempt status under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code.
